Coaching the Cats

The Bobcats are led by Tom Rogish in his second season as head coach in the program's 48-year history. Last season, Rogish guided FSU to a 3-6 overall record against arguably the nation's toughest schedule. The Bobcats led the ACFC in interceptions (12) and turnover margin (+2) and finished second in red zone offense (81.8), pass offense (182.7) and pass efficiency (138.1).

Rogish brought over 30 years of coaching experience to Frostburg State including 29 years in the collegiate ranks. He spent the last 22 years at the Division II level at perennial powers Indiana (Pa.) and Shepherd (W.Va.).

Prior to his arrival in Frostburg, Rogish spent two years on the defensive staff at Shepherd College. The Rams made back-to-back trips to the NCAA Tournament in 2006 and 2007 including a run to the NCAA Division II Northeast Region championship this past fall.

New Additions

This year, the FSU coaching staff has also seen some additions and changes that will bring new perspective and excitement to the all ready veteran staff.

Jim Crawley, legendary coach and avid supporter of Frostburg State athletics, rejoins the staff in 2009 and will be in charge of the kicking game. Crawley served as head football coach for seven seasons from 1968-74 and is the winningest coach in school history with 33 victories. Crawley coached 17 FSU Hall of Fame selections,

2009 Season Preview

With a year under his belt as the head coach of the Frostburg State University football program, Tom Rogish is moving forward with the turn around and revision of Bobcat football in 2009. Rogish, who guided FSU to a 3-6 overall record in 2008 against the nation's toughest schedule, is optimistic about the returning core of players and some off-season changes that will keep Frostburg State headed in the right direction.

"Our good offseason workout program and the development of team leaders – not just at the senior level, but the junior and sophomore levels was well – has boosted team morale and has the players excited about what is to come," said Rogish.

After last season, Rogish and the rest of the Bobcat coaching staff instilled a new workout and lifting program that will help the strength and agility of the team. The team also added a players' leadership committee to facilitate better communication between the team and the coaching staff.

"The development of the leadership committee has allowed the players and coaches to be comfortable with one another and provided the players with a larger voice," added Rogish.

Special Teams

One of the strengths of the 2009 Bobcat football team will be the special teams unit. With the additions of Crawley and Hunter on the coaching side of things, seniors **Nick Payne (Frostburg, Md./Northern Garrett)** and **Avery Willie (Aberdeen, Md./Aberdeen)** and junior **Mike Shriner (Annapolis, Md./St. Mary's)** all return to lead a unit that is filled with talent.

Payne has been one of the nation's best punters throughout his time in a Bobcat uniform. He has totaled 5,485 yards during his previous three seasons and has led the ACFC in average yards per punt in each of those years as well. A Second Team All-ACFC selection last year, Payne ranked 41st in the nation in yards per punt (38.0) and led the conference in yards and number of punts. As a junior, Payne earned Third Team D3Football.com All-South Region honors and was named to the All-ACFC First Team.

Willie proved to be a triple threat for the Bobcats last season after leaving his mark on the ACFC and FSU record books. In just his first season with the Bobcats in 2008, Willie set the FSU and ACFC record after twice returning seven kicks in games against Washington & Jefferson and Ithaca. Willie also set the school record with 618 kick return yards and set both an FSU and ACFC mark with 35 returns on the season. He posted a season-high 105 yards on seven kick returns against Ithaca.

Shriner returns for his third year as the starting long snapper. At 6'2" and 210 pounds, Shriner is athletic enough to move up and down the field to help in kick-and-punt coverage as well.

The biggest question about the special teams unit in 2009 - who will be handling the kicking duties. A group of three freshmen will battle for the vacancy left by Matt Winnegar, who finished second in kicking in the ACFC a year ago.

In terms of numbers, the defensive unit returns the most starters from last season (6) and will be led by arguably the most talented and mature secondary group in the ACFC. The defense also has switched to a 4-3 in 2009 that should provide more flexibility. The new defense should also allow for more eight and nine man fronts that should help stop the run.

Seven players return to the secondary from 2008 including juniors Terry **l Monroe (Temple Hill, Md./Dematha)** and Deshawn Lewis (**Bowie, Md./Largo**), who combined for a total of 17 starts.

Monroe was a First Team All-ACFC selection last fall and finished third in the league in tackles per game (7.2). He also finished tied for third in passes defended (8) and seventh interceptions (2). Monroe made a career-high 12 tackles against Salisbury in the Tenth Annual Regents Cup game.

Lewis posted 27 tackles on the season, including 2.0 tackles for loss. He finished tied for third on the team with seven passes defended and posted an interception against Ithaca.

Sophomore **Kevin Matthews (Temple Hills, Md./Oxon Hill)** was third in the secondary group with five starts in the fall and earned All-ACFC Second Team honors. He led the defense and the ACFC with four interceptions, finished fourth on the team with 43 tackles and was tied for third on the team with seven passes defended.

Junior **Mike Joseph (Hyattsville, Md./Northwest)** and sophomore **Jim Lohr (Bowie, Md./Archbishop Spalding)** each made four starts during their first seasons of action last year. Joseph made 19 tackles with three passes defended while Lohr finished eighth on the team with 31 total tackles and two interceptions.

Junior **Ian Turner (Hanover, Md./Meade)** and sophomore **Rashad James (Washington, Md./Anacostia)** each return to the lineup with three starts under their belts from last year. Turner made nine tackles with four passes defended while James had 19 tackles and tied for the team lead with eight passes defended.

The linebacker unit is a talented group without a whole lot of playing experience, allowing for younger players to step in and see significant time this fall.

Senior **George Feiser (Hagerstown, Md./Smithsburg)** led the team and finished second in the ACFC in tackles per game (7.8). A First Team All-ACFC honoree in just his first season with the Bobcats last fall as a junior, Feiser collected 70 total tackles, 3.0 for loss and one sack. He had three games with double-digit stops, including a career-high 12 against Salisbury.

Junior **Rob Stone (Derwood, Md./Magruder)** and sophomore **Jordan Downs (Balitmore, Md./New Town)** will also return to the lineup this season. Stone played in all nine games last season with nine tackles while Downs appeared in six games with three tackles.

Sophomores **Drew Rudisill (York, Pa./Red Lion)** and **Travis Blair (Upper Marlboro, Md./Oxon Hill)** are two up-and-coming talents who will contribute to the linebacking corps this year.

The interior of the defensive line is a big question on the minds of the coaching staff this coming season. Senior Collin Clifford and Mike Lorentzen both graduated after stellar four-year careers and left two huge voids.

Junior **Nick Giofre (Wilmington, Del./McKean)** and sophomores **Ryan Simmons (Bel Air, Md./C. Milton Wright)**, **Joe Sharp (Hughesville, Md./LaPlata)** and **Anschel Maile-Moskowitz (Mount Rainer, Md./Waldorf)** could all compete for the two inside vacancies. Giofre played in four contests last year while Sharp will look to make the conversion to the defensive side of the ball after appearing in four

games on the offensive line a year ago.

Three players are battling it out for the two defensive end positions. Senior **Mike Iheakanwa (Lantham, Md./Duval)** and **Stanley Eppes (Baltimore, Md./Patterson)** return as the veterans on the end. Iheakanwa was fifth on the squad last season with 42 tackles, including a team-high 5.0 tackles for loss, while Eppes made 26 tackles including 3.5 TFL. Sophomore **Michael Ezeani (Glendale, Md./Eleanor Roosevelt)** will push the two seniors for significant playing time after playing in eight games last season.

Offense

The offensive side of the ball has some of the bigger question marks for the 2009 Bobcats. The offensive line and quarterback positions have some key holes to fill if the team wants to return to its form in 2008 where FSU had the ACFC's second best passing offense.

Senior **Ben Crowder (Boydton, Va./Bluestone)** returns for his third-consecutive year as the teams starting center. A two-time All-ACFC performer, Crowder has started 18 games over the last two years and returns as the anchor for a line that has allowed the lowest total of sacks in the ACFC over that span.

Junior **Patrick Fears (Washington, D.C./Archbishop Carroll)** will see time on the offensive line. Fears, who missed all of last season with an injury, played in two games with one start as a freshman in 2007 while sophomore **Joe Sharp** played in four games last season and could potentially split time on the defensive line as well.

The Bobcat coaching staff will also look to fill the open spots with transfers and incoming freshmen this year. The 2009 FSU starting lineup will also be without a tight end heading in the season, with the graduation of last year's starter Ben Tate.

The quarterback position is up for grabs this fall and three sophomores have emerged as the frontrunners: **Josh Volpe (Germantown, Md./Northwest)**, **Steve Simmons (Charlotte Hall, Md./LaPlata)** and **Lyndon Harris (Forestville, Md./Largo)**.

Volpe returns as the only player with any game experience as he played in the Tenth Annual Regents Cup game against Salisbury last season. He played the entire second half and completed 9-of-12 passes for 156 yards and one touchdown. He grabbed ACFC Rookie of the Week honors during the final week of the season for his effort against Salisbury.

Simmons and Harris have both spent a year with the Bobcat team and have competed at the junior varsity level. All three potential starting quarterbacks will have an easier transition this fall with the return of the ACFC's most talented group of wideouts.

The wide receivers should be an exciting group to watch this season as seniors **Makiha Cooper (Baltimore, Md./Forest Park)**, **Avery Willie** and **Ali Konteh (Hyattsville, Md./Northwest)** all return from a year ago.

Cooper was an ACFC Second Team selection last year after leading the league in receiving yards (786), longest reception (73) and average yards per game (82.0). He was also second in the conference in receiving touchdowns (6) and receptions (40). Cooper earned Mike McGlinchey Most Outstanding Player honors in the Tenth Annual Regents Cup after totaling 207 total yards; 107 kick return yards and 100 receiving yards.

Willie is a triple threat for FSU as a kick and punt returner and as wide out. After a record-setting season in kick returning, Willie also finished second on the Bobcats in receiving yards (313) and receptions (30) and was third with two touchdown receptions.

Konteh had a breakout year as a junior after opening the season with a touchdown reception in each of the first three games. He finished the year with 12 catches for 161 yards and three scores.

This season, sophomore **Adam Butts (Hagerstown, Md./Greencastle-Antrim)** also figures into the lineup as he has greatly improved over the last year.

The offensive backfield is a unit loaded with talent as juniors **Anthony King (Germantown, Md./Northwest)** and **Anton Wade (Baltimore, Md./Patterson)** return as the mainstays from the last two years. Wade ran for 565 yards on 135 carries and five touchdowns last fall while King totaled 353 yards and one touchdown. Together, the duo provides one of the best one-two punches in the region.

However, the fullback position is vacant after the graduation of Donnie Snyder and two sophomores have emerged as the frontrunners. Sophomore **Derek Sheely (Germantown, Md./Northwest)** and **Kevin Nichols (Clinton, Md./Surratsville)** each saw valuable playing time last fall and should compete for the starting position.
