FSU looks to avenge its 38-6 loss to Wesley last season at Bobcat Stadium. A win for the Bobcats would hand Frostburg State its 10th win over Wesley

The Bobcats lead the all-time series 9-7, Wesley has won the last five meetings. The last win for the Bobcats came in 2003 when they beat Wesley 42-39 in overtime in Dover, Del.

Coaching the Cats

The Bobcats are led by Tom Rogish in his second season as head coach in the program's 48-year history. Last season, Rogish guided FSU to a 3-6 overall record against arguably the nation's toughest schedule. The Bobcats led the ACFC in interceptions (12) and turnover margin (+2) and finished second in red zone offense (81.8), pass offense (182.7) and pass efficiency (138.1).

Rogish brought over 30 years of coaching experience to Frostburg State including 29 years in the collegiate ranks. He spent the last 22 years at the Division II level at perennial powers Indiana (Pa.) and Shepherd (W.Va.).

Prior to his arrival in Frostburg, Rogish spent two years on the defensive staff at Shepherd College. The Rams made back-to-back trips to the NCAA Tournament in 2006 and 2007 including a run to the NCAA Division II Northeast Region championship this past fall.

First Year Hits

This year, the FSU coaching staff has also seen some additions and changes that will bring new perspective and excitement to the all ready veteran staff.

Jim Crawley, legendary coach and avid supporter of Frostburg State athletics, rejoins the staff in 2009 and will be in charge of the kicking game. Crawley served as head football coach for seven seasons from 1968-74 and is the winningest coach in school history with 33 victories. Crawley coached 17 FSU Hall of Fame selections, including Bob Maddox, who was drafted by the NFL's Cincinnati Bengals in 1972.

Tom Vent, who helped the Bobcats in 2008, returns to the coaching staff

in 2009 as the director of quality control. He will oversee all aspects of the team and will be in charge of gameday and pressbox organization. He will also serve as the chief alumni liaison, as he is an alum himself (Class of 1972).

Four-year NFL veteran **Javin Hunter** joins the Frostburg State staff this fall as the wide receivers coach after playing for both the Baltimore Ravens (2002-04) and the San Francisco 49ers (2005). While with the Ravens, Hunter helped the team to 26 wins and the franchises first-ever AFC North Division Title in 2003. Hunter will direct a wide receiver group featuring three returners that make up one of the finest units in the ACFC.

Jeff Rogish, son of head coach Tom Rogish, also joins the FSU staff this fall, bringing a strong background in computer technology and video to the team's efforts. He will direct the technology side of the staff and will also work with the tight ends.

Leading the Way

Five Bobcats are on top of the leaderboard for the ACFC this week. Linebacker Travis Blair and free safety Jim Lohr lead the league with tackles 39 and 37, respectively. Freshman kicker Zachary Beukers has made four field goals to tie Tommy Kowalick (Salisbury) for the lead in the ACFC. Senior wide receiver Avery Willie has control of both all-purpose yards (642) and kickoff returns (312). Wide receiver Makiha Cooper sits on top of receptions (20) and receiving yards (369).

All-Purpose Player

The Bobcats senior wide receiver Avery Willie has proven to be the go-to-guy when the Bobcats want to move the ball down field. Last week against Widener, Willie picked up 149 more yards to bring his total to 642 all-purpose yards so far this season including 312 from kickoff returns and 270 receiving yards.

Making History

Stepping in for injured Phoenix Butler-Poole, sophomore quarterback Josh Volpe had a career game against Widener last week. Volpe threw for 313 yards, the eighth highest single game in Frostburg State history. Volpe had a 77-yard completion to Makiha Cooper good for the 10th longest completion in school history.

I'll Take Rushing for 1,000

Frostburg State junior tailback Anton Wade needed just four rushing yards to eclipse 1,000 for his career entering last week's game against Widener. Wade eclipsed that plateau against Widener last week as he picked up 22 rushing yards to bring his career total to 1018.

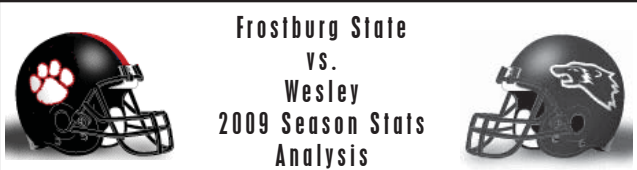

Above and Beyond

Frostburg State senior wide receiver Makiha Cooper entered the 2009 season with 799 receiving yards. After the first three games of the season, he amassed 167 yards to bring his total to 966. Cooper needed just 34 more yards to reach the 1,000-yard plateau, which he surpassed against Widener. Cooper picked up an impressive 202 yards, just nine short of the school record, to bring his career total to 1168, tied for 11th all-time. Among his catches was a 77-yard pass from quarterback Josh Volpe.

The Big Stop

Sophomores Jim Lohr and Travis Blair continue to build on their season success, leading the team in tackles together averaging 19 stops a game. The duo of Lohr and Blair have combined for two interceptions, 1.5 TFL, one broken up pass and three defended passes. Following closely behind are seniors Mike Iheakanwa and George Feiser and junior Terryl Monroe who are averaging a combined 17.25 tackles per game and have posted one interception, 10 TFL, 2.5 sacks, two broken up passes, two defended passes and forced one fumble.

Total Offense

In the first four games of the season, the Bobcats have averaged 342 yards of total offense a game. At this mark last season, FSU was averaging 289. Frostburg State will look to continue this success against the tough Wesley defence which allowed LaGrange College to pick up only 143 total offensive yards last week.

Second Times A Charm

Coach Rogish will try and increase his win total in his second year at the helm after posting a 3-6 overall record in 2008. Seven coaches in FSU's 48-year history have increased their win total from their first season to their second. The largest increase in wins came in 1993 when Mike McGlinchey, who won six games his first season in '92, won 10 games and took the Bobcats to their first-ever NCAA Tournament.

The Bobcats Last Week ...

Widener University scored touchdowns on its first three possessions of the second half and wore down the Frostburg State University defense as the Pride earned a 35-16 win over the Bobcats, in non-conference football action Saturday afternoon.

All three drives covered over 60 yards and totaled roughly 16 minutes as the Pride (2-1) ate away much of the second half clock and kept the Bobcat (0-4) offense on the sideline.

WU amassed 442 total yards of offense, including 276 on the ground. Meanwhile, FSU totaled 357 yards behind 313 through the air and 44 on the ground.

Frostburg State starting quarterback Josh Volpe (Germantown, Md./Northwest) threw for all 313 yards in his first collegiate start, the eighth highest single game total in school history. He completed 21-of-36 pass attempts, including a touchdown to senior wide receiver Makiha Cooper (Baltimore, Md./Forest

Park) and a one-yard scoring run, both in the fourth.

Cooper had an outstanding day catching the football. He finished with 202 yards, just nine yards shy of the school record. He also hauled in nine receptions and one touchdown. In the third, Volpe and Cooper hooked up on a 77-yard pass play that is tied for the 10th longest in school history.

Sophomore defensive back Jim Lohr (Bowie, Md./Archbishop Spalding) led the Bobcats with 10 tackles while sophomore Travis Blair (Upper Marlboro, Md./Oxon Hill) had nine stops.

Widener produced a touchdown in each of the first two quarters. Chris Haupt tossed an eight-yard touchdown to Dom DePasquale with 5:58 left in the first quarter for a 7-0 lead. In the second, Adam Smith found the endzone from four yards out to increase the Pride lead to 14-0 with just over a minute left in the half.

However, FSU got the ball back with 1:08 to play until halftime and moved 74 yards in seven plays. Volpe connected twice on the drive to Cooper for 50 and 18 yards and the Bobcats moved down to the WU one-yard line. Bobcat freshman Zachary Beukers (Lusby, Md./Calvert Hall) kicked an 18-yard field goal as time expired in the half as FSU trailed 14-3.

The first Widener touchdown of the third quarter capped an 85-yard 15-play drive (6:25) that resulted in a Marc Bandola 11-yard scoring pass to Tim Schaub. The second drive lasted 4:32, covering 75 yards on nine plays, capped by an eight-yard touchdown run by Ian Decker. The Pride's final score came early in the fourth, as Adam Smith capped an 11-play 63-yard drive (5:22) that extended the host lead to 35-3.

The Bobcats scored two touchdowns in the fourth quarter. Volpe found Cooper on a crossing route for a 15-yard touchdown at 7:41 that finished off a six-play 50-yard drive. After holding the Pride to just five yards on its ensuing possession, FSU found the endzone again. Volpe and Cooper hooked up again, this time for 77 yards, to put the Bobcats on Widener's eight-yard line. Three plays later, Volpe plunged in for a one-yard score behind his offensive line.

The Last Meeting with The Wolverines ...

Shane McSweeney threw for 289 yards and three touchdowns to lead No. 12 ranked Wesley to a 38-6 win over Frostburg State, Saturday on FSU's Homecoming.

The loss hands the Bobcats (1-3, 0-1) their first defeat on Homecoming in five years while the Wolverines (2-1, 1-0 ACFC) extended their winning streak over FSU to five-straight games.

Wesley led the game in just about every statistical category including first downs (24-10), rushing yards (230-40), passing yards (289-127) and total offense (519-167).

WC scored on its first six possessions of the game including four-straight touchdowns as it led 38-0 early in the fourth. FSU scored its only touchdown with 4:34 left in the game as junior quarterback **Bryan Brosnan (Leesburg, Va./Heritage)** found classmate **Makiha Cooper (Baltimore, Md./Forest Park)** for a 70-yard touchdown to end the shutout.

Brosnan finished the day 8-of-13 for 127 yards with a touchdown and an interception while Cooper hauled in two receptions for 86 yards and that fourth quarter score. Sophomore **Anthony King (Germantown, Md./Northwest)** led the Bobcat ground game with 17 carries for 58 yards.

Wesley scored four touchdowns in the opening half including three in the second quarter to blow the game open early. McSweeney found Jon Lanouette for an eight-yard touchdown with 6:21 left in the first quarter as WC led 7-0. The visitors added two rushing touchdowns early in the second quarter as they led 21-0. Mike Pennewell found the endzone from two yards out at 14:53 and Aaron Jackson scored from the one just three and half minutes into the second quarter. WC closed out the half as McSweeney found Lanouette for a 17-yard touchdown and a 28-0 lead at the half.

Collin Blugis tacked on a 30-yard field goal midway through the third and Larry Beavers, who led all players with 111 yards receiving, scored the final Wolverine touchdown on a 40-yard pass early in the fourth for a 38-0 advantage.

Brosnan and Cooper ended the game's scoring with their 70-yard touchdown with 4:34 showing on the clock.

Junior **George Feiser (Hagerstown, Md./Smithsburg/Salisbury)** and sophomore **Terryl Monroe (Temple Hills, Md./Dematha)** led the way for the Bobcats with 11 tackles each. Sophomore **Deshawn Lewis (Bowie, Md./Largo)** added eight tackles including 1.0 TFL.

Frostburg State Two-Deep Offense
